John Kay b 1777 - Labourer/Tailor

In 1841 lived on the Windsor Road along with his wife Mary daughter Jane (15) (see Memorial 3) and Edward Kay (aged 50) presumably his brother.

(In 1851 we find a John Kay living on the Braywick Road registered blind and living as their uncle with the family of Edward Burton.)

Mary Kay b 1786
Mother of Jane Giles (see memorial stone 3).

Thomas Merritt b 1781

Mary Merrit b 1785

Agricultural labourer lived with Mary on Boyn Hill (1851)

(Merritt deaths in 1858 or 1862 are confirmed as Cookham)

Thomas Giles b 1820 South Stoke, Oxfordshire

Jane Giles b 1825 Maidenhead

Married in Lambeth in September 1848 In 1851 Thomas & Jane lived in Lambeth with Jane's mother Mary Kay (see Memorial 1).

In 1861 they lived in 8 Chester Place, Lambeth with family Rosa, Edward and William and widowed mother Mary Kay (A Rosannah Giles died Criocklade Jun 1844)

In 1871 Jane still lived in Lambeth with her three children: Edward Kay (14), William Henry (12) and Frederick Ernest. (9) along with her mother Mary Kay

Clara Brown b 1829 Beaconsfield

Daughter of John and Annie Brown, John became a a Maidenhead Master Butcher in Maidenhead High St.

> Clara had two sisters Kate (b 1861) and Alice (b 1869)

Died 25th Day of April 1848 In The 75th Year Of His Age



In Memory Of SILVIA HUSSEY

Died 24th Day Of November 1861 In The 72 nd Year Of Her Age

Also Lucy Hussey Who died October 1852 aged 6 years

ELIZABETH WHITE who died Nov 23rd 1876 aged 78 years Also of ELIZA SYMMONS Daughter Of The Above Wife Of Charles SYMMONS Who died April 13th 1871 aged 35 years



Also of FRANCIS WHITE Who died Sept 1 1884 aged 68 years

Henry Hussey b 1774

Probably the brother of Abraham Hussey. Living off Maidenhead High St (Back Lane) in 1841 with Selina Hussey (45), Sarah lHussey (15) and Mary Hussey (10)

Silvia Hussey b 1789 Marlow

Silvia Hussey probably the sister of Abraham Hussey born in Turville, Buckinghamshire. Abraham is listed in successive censuses as Pawn Broker then as an Auctioneer and Cabinet Maker. He and his wife Mary Ann had two children Lucy Eliza (b 1844) and Thomas (b 1851).

1861 living in Cookham High Street next door but one to William Hewitt (see memorial 9)

Lucy Eliza Hussey b 1844

Daughter of Abraham and Mary Ann Hussey

Elizabeth White b 1798

Elizabeth was the first wife of Daniel White a gardener. They lived in Forlease Road (1841) then later in Bridge Street Their daughter Eliza married Charles Symmons (b Somerton, Somerset) Draper and Grocer.

In 1881 Daniel was gardener to the household of the children of Sir George Scott in Maidenhead High Street. Sir George Scott was Governor of Lucknow, India. Daniel died In September 1904 aged 99.

Francis White b 1816 Arborfield - Gardener

What relationship Francis had to Daniel white has not been established.

In Loving remembrance of the Rev JOSEPH PORTREY of Shaftesbury who entered into rest on the 10th October 1880 aged 66 years

Also of MARTHA PORTREY his wife.

She died at Alton on the 12th Nov 1881 aged 86

The Portrey Memorials

Two memorial stones on the East Side of the Churh name five of the Portrey Family, Joseph (father), Martha (mother) and three of their children Richard Watson, Jabez Bunting, and Robert Newton.

Joseph Portrey was Superintendent Minister of the Windsor & Maidenhead Circuit and it was while in Windsor that his son, Richard, died and was interred here at High Street in April 1869. However shortly after being transferred to the Shaftesbury Circuit, Joseph himself died and his remains were brought back, by train, to be interred at High Street in October 1880. Within a year Martha, Joseph's widow, died and was also interred at High Street. Tragedy then struck the family as the two remaining sons, Ministers of Religion, both died - Jabez Bunting Portrey in Adelaide and Robert Newton Portrey in the West Indies. The latter having been married in September 1881 leaving a widow Alice (nee Pearce) and no children. The only surviving child of the Portrey family being their daughter Susannah Wesley Higgins with her three young daughters Helena Victoria, Susannah Portrey and Josephine Alice.

Joseph and Mary Portrey's four children were named after four significant figures in the history of Methodism:-

Richard Watson (1781 - 1833) Active in the formation of the Wesleyan Missionary Society and President of the Conference in 1826

Susannah Wesley (1669 - 1742). The Mother of the John and Charles Wesley

Jabez Bunting (1779 - 1858) Founder of the Wesleyan Missionary Society and President of Conference 1820, 1828, 1836 and 1844.

Robert Newton (1780 - 1854) President of Conference 1824, 1832, 1840 and 1848

In memory of WILLIAM HEWITT Who fell asleep in Jesus Oct 17th 1875 aged 55 years

William Hewitt, b 1821 - Marylebone

Aged 15 he resolved to become a Christian. Spent some time in Ireland and came to Maidenhead in 1851. Member of the Good Templars and a Master Tailor. (Obit MA 27 October 1875).

Harriet Hewitt b 1819 -Westminster

In 1861 the family lived in High Street Maidenhead,

Harriet (42) b Westminster 1816 Thophilus (15) b Kensington Sep 1845 Rosina (12) Kensington Jan 1848 William (9) b Edwin (6) b Alfred Charles (4) b Chorlton Sep 1857 Emily (4) b Chorlton Sep 1857 - died 1859

Samuel Andrews b 1833 Louth, Lincolnshire
Son of Thomas Andrews a farmer
In 1851 he was apprenticed to his uncle as a druggist.

Barbara Collins Andrews (nee Fumess) b 1835 Maidenhead (Sister of Elizabeth Fawcett Cleare - see memorial stone 14)

When Barbara was 6 her mother died. In 1841 the Cleare household was: James (40), Barbara (6), Elizabeth (5), John (4) In Memory of HENRY JAMES COOPER
Died 5th March 1868 Aged 72 Years Christ Is My Only Hope

SARAH SERENA COLE
Daughter of HENRY JAMES and MARTHA COOPER
Died 13th March 1860 Aged 40 years

Henry Cooper b 1797 St Georges, London

Martha Cooper b 1797 Uxbridge

In 1851 they were living in Maidenhead High Street with their daughter Sarah Cole and her husband Charles Cole and their son Frederick Cooper

In 1861 they were living in Braywick Road with their two grandchildren Charles Cole (15) and Julia E Cooper (3)

Thomas Arrowsmith b 1764 location unknown

Martha Arrowsmith b 1784 London

1841 they were living in London with family: Henry, Elizabeth, Elizabeth and new baby.

1851 Martha was living in Littlewick Cottage with family: Henry (57) Elizabeth (daughter in law) (45), Elizabeth A (16), Charlotte (8), George William ?(6), William Henry (5) along with a Governess Jane Hair.

He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the Book of Life; but I will confess his name before my father Mary Ann Curtis Treffrey. Born Mary Ann Curtis Cullern daughter of Thomas Cullern Mayor of Maidenhead 1793. Influential in establishing the Sunday School at the Methodist Chapel in Holyport. Married to Richard Treffrey President of the Methodist Conference 1833. Mother of Robert Walker, grandmother of John Wesley Walker and step-mother to Jemima Griffin Higgs Higgs.

<u>John Higgs.</u> Local Preacher. Heldmany Church offices. Variously Chemist, Postmaster, Alderman, Magistrate. Mayor ???. Brother in Law of Robert Walker. Foundation stones bear his name. There is a memorial plaque in the church to John & Jemima Higgs. His portrait is in the vestry.

Robert Walker. Local Preacher. Sunday School Superintendent 1845 - 1886. Mayor of Maidenhead 1871 & 1872. Variously Postmaster, Chairman of the Maidenhead Gas Company and Magistrate. Jemima Higgs' half-brother. Foundation stones bear his name. (Obit MA 11 August 1886). His portrait is in the vestry.

Ann Walker. Born Ann Wright daughter of Murrel and Mary Wright of Sunninghill. Married Robert Walker in 1847. Her portrait is in the vestry.

<u>Jemima Higgs</u>. Wife of John Higgs and the instigator of John becoming a Christian. (Obit MA 10 November 1886). Foundation stones bear her name. There is a memorial plaque in the church to John & Jemima Higgs. Her portrait is in the vestry



Charles Cleare b 1828 Burnham.

Charles came to Maidenhead in 1842 and started his own business as librarian, printer & stationer and later became Maidenhead Postmaster. Was Chapel Steward, Class Leader and Local Preacher for many years. Suffered from Bright's Disease and lived seven years after a serious pioneering cancer operation. (Obit MA 2 November 1896). Laid a Foundation Stone.

Elizabeth Fawcett Cleare b 1832 High Wycombe

Charles and Elizabeth had one daughter Elizabeth Susanna Cleare who married Arthur Upson in December 1887. Arthur Upson was Chemist, Druggist, Optician and a Local Preacher. They had eight children: Arthur Cleare, (1888), Arthu Charles (1890), Robert Henry (1893), Dorothy Barbara (1896), Marjorie Elizabeth (1896), Edith Annie (1898), Thomas Wilfred (1902), Kathleen Irene (1904)

Arthur Cleare Upson b 1888 Maidenhead

The first of Charles and Elizabeth's children who died in infancy

William Woodbridge b 1821 Builder

In 1838 William, then a carpenter, married Amelia Jones. They started life in Park Street then moved to Queen Street and had a large family: Sarah Jane (1839), <u>Catherine</u> (1843), William Augustus (1845), Selina (1847), <u>John Henry</u> (1849), Charles Albert (1851), Eliza Augusta (1855), George Jones (1857), Florence Harriet (1859), Frank (1861), David Walter (1866)

Thomas Stutchbury b 1789 Grocer

Born Buckinghamshire

Well known Maidenhead family

Died in London 16th July 1855 aged 69 years.

In memory of Mrs SARAH SWALES Who died on the 9th day of January 1868 Aged 67 years "Her end was peace"



Also of Mr JOSEPH SWALES
Who died the 15th day of December 1887
Aged 89 years

William Hackshaw

(No trace)

Aaron Hyatt

At one time Aaron was a corporal in the 1st Life Guards, but after his discharge kept the Vine Inn, Market Street, Maidenhead

Henry Hyatt

Operated a Blacksmiths Shop in Hobart, Australia before returning home to England. Died of a stroke

Joseph Swales b 1798 St Albans

John made his living in Maidenhead as a Coach Builder

Sarah Swales b 1801 Wattlinngton

Joseph and Sarah lived in Sun Cottage on the Marlow Road

At one time Joseph was an Alderman of the town

John King b 1793 Hounslow

Susan King b 1793 St Albans

In 1861 they were living in High Street Cookham with Silvia Hussey as a lodger (see memorial 5)

Sacred to the memory of Mr JOHN KING Who died June 20 th 1860 in his 74 the year

Also Ann King who died 11 December 1813

In Memory Of JOHN ILLSLEY Who died 20 th December 1865 aged 61 years

In Memory of Mrs MARY ILLSLEY Who died 26 th March 1861 aged 79 There is a record of **John Illsley** dying in Lambeth and **Mary Illsley** dying at Cookham

Otherwise no other records have so far been found
